FY 2023 South Campus Statistics

Haven's South Campus or Low-Barrier Shelter offers safe, indoor, congregate sleeping for individuals (men and women). There are no ID requirements, and clients can remain active in their addiction but cannot have drugs or alcohol in their possession while inside Haven's facilities. South Campus clients can access ID recovery, housing, substance use counseling, medical care, eye care, dental care, mental health counseling, and more. Clients must opt-into these services.

FY 2023 Transformational Campus Statistics

Haven's Transformational North Campus is for individual clients and families. Requirements for entry include possessing a valid ID, residing in Bexar County for at least nine months cumulative, committing to sobriety while on Haven's campus, and being actively engaged in housing and income plans.

Families at Haven for Hope

There has been a marked increase in the number of families experiencing homelessness in our community. Haven operates a 92-bed family residential dorm (FRC) in addition to a Family Emergency Services (FES) program designed for 25 "overflow" families. In FY 2023, we served an average of 60 FES families a day. Contributing factors leading to the sharp increase in families include inflation, rising rent prices, and the discontinuation of the eviction moratorium.

Young Adults at Haven for Hope

Haven created a Young Adults (YA) designated sleeping area and specialized case management program for clients ages 18-24. YA Programming is available on both North and South Campus.
